Dear Children and Parents,
Welcome back to a new term. We hope you all had a restful Easter break. This term's topic is Ancient Rome. Areas of study will include the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain, as well as a focus on European geography and volcanoes. ## P.E./Games

In cold weather, children can wear blue or black skins or the school Orion sports top. Please ensure all PE kit is named. Children with pierced ears will have to remove earrings for all PE lessons.

## Art

## Homework

Children in Class 3 are expected to do approximately 15 minutes reading with an adult daily. Reading is an important part of homework and children in this class benefit greatly from reading with an adult and discussing the text. We encourage parents to comment about their child's reading in the 'Home' section of the planner. If children are not reading to an adult, additional homework tasks will be set - please see the newsletter dated 5.4.19.

In addition to reading, children are expected to practise times tables daily to support their maths learning. In Class 3 children will be set a weekly maths task each Monday, which will sometimes be online; this should take approximately 20 minutes to complete and the children will hand this in on the following Monday. Children should bring their reading book and Planner to school each day.
