

Class 3 – Summer 2022

Invaders and Settlers

Mathematics

Number: Developing a sound understanding of place value. Developing mental fluency and written calculation skills to add, subtract, multiply and divide confidently. Building knowledge of the times tables. Choosing appropriate strategies to solve problems. Adding and subtracting fractions, relating division to fractions.

Shape and Measure: Developing understanding and vocabulary of shape and angle, including measuring perimeters. Telling the time 5, 10, 20 minutes later using am/pm and 24-hour clock.

Data: Drawing and interpreting pictograms and bar graphs with different scales and using these to record and analyse data.

Science

Light: need for light; how light reflects; how shadows are formed and their patterns. Forces and magnets: comparing how they move; observing magnets; understanding they have two poles and how they react to each other; comparing everyday materials.

History

Study some of the many aspects Roman Britain including: Invasion, Boudicca's revolt, Roman army; Comparison of the Roman and Celtic way of life, Roman legacy in Britain.

Geography

Focus on the physical and human geography of modern Europe including rivers and mountains, Research a European capital city and examine the weather from each of Europe's climate zones. Research national and local specialities and how climate zones affects industry.

Art

Designing and making mosaics. Study of the artist Alma Thomas. Developing skills and techniques including paint, and sketching.



Computing

Internet safety: health and well-being and lifestyle, privacy and security. Digital literacy: programming Scratch using events and actions, data and information using branching databases.

Design Technology

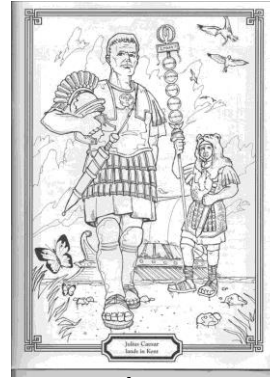
Food and Nutrition: preparing and designing packaging suitable for pizzas. Making pizzas and fruit crumbles.

French

Learning new vocabulary through story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar': fruits, colours, numbers, days of the week; ask and answer questions (café).

Religious Education

The Kingdom of God and Pentecost
The Lord's Prayer – why is it important for Christians?
An introduction to The Qur'an and the Prophet Muhammad (pbuh)

Explanation and Report writing.

Fiction: Narrative and news reporting (Escape from Pompeii by Christina Ballit); Mystery writing (Ottoline and the Yellow Cat by Chris Riddell)

Poetry: Poetry linked to topic.

Sentence structure, spelling and punctuation.
Reading and comprehension skills.

Physical Education

Rounders and Athletics (including running, catching, and throwing skills)
Swimming: Following the National Curriculum programme for swimming

Exploring pitch and notation and developing performance skills.
