The chronology of Tudor period and where it fits in; Tudor monarchs; Religious changes - Break with Rome, Protestantism and Martin Luther, the Dissolution of the monasteries; Use of primary and secondary sources: Kentwell visit.

COMPUTING

Communication - design, create and evaluate own presentations maximising the use of ICT to present information in different ways. Research - Analyse information and ask questions using complex searches.

MATHS

Converting mixed numbers into improper fractions and vice versa. Equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. Adding and subtracting fractions. Multiplying fractions. Factors and multiples. Finding percentages of amounts. Shape and measure: Reading Roman numerals to 1000. Interpreting and presenting continuous data using line graphs. Properties of 2d and 3d shapes. Nets of 3d shapes. Plotting coordinates in first 2 quadrants. Describing position of a shape before / after reflection, translation and rotation. Interpret timetables using 24hour clock. Calculate time intervals.
