#### **World Religion Week**

The children have enjoyed and participated in a wide range of activities both in an out of lessons to support their knowledge and awareness of RE. Thank you to the many volunteers and special visitors who have given their time to facilitate these activities. Special thanks must go to Mrs Starbuck for coordinating this RE Theme Week.













#### **Highlights of our RE Week:**

Along with other schools in the area, Year 6 attended the Holocaust Memorial Service on Monday. This was an opportunity for further reflection on the experiences of George Szirtes who had visited the class last week. His moving story includes being the son of a Holocaust survivor who then, as an eight year old boy, had to flee Hungary as his family were once again subjected to persecution for their faith. There was an opportunity for the children to ask further questions and join in some prayers and singing with other local schools to remember all those who have suffered in this way. The children's behaviour was exemplary and we were very grateful to Mrs Balchin, Mrs Cullen, Mrs Trigg and Mrs Fernall for helping with transport.

Year 3 and Year 6 spent time reflecting in our special Prayer Space on Tuesday. Mrs Campbell converted the library into a tranquil, inspiring place where the children could spend time focusing on thoughts and prayers. Feedback from the children is really positive about the opportunity to take time-out for their thoughts and prayers. Thank you to Mrs Campbell for the time and considerable enthusiasm that she spends creating such a calming environment.

Year 6 took on the role of museum guides on Wednesday when they showed the other children in school religious artefacts from the six main world religions. This was an opportunity for everyone to find out how objects hold special meaning and are used in different faiths while also comparing their similarities and differences. Reception Class particularly enjoyed visiting the Year 6 pop-up museum, exploring the different resources and listening to their buddies talk about the different artefacts.

Reception class welcomed students from SWCHS who talked about Ramadan and Eid al fitr. They shared their personal experience of being a Muslim and Reception class asked lots of questions. The children then designed their own Mehndi patterns.

Reverend John Goddard led our collective worship on Thursday and told us the story of John the Baptist. The children joined in with an upbeat song typical of those used in a Baptist Service and asked some thoughtful questions. He then spent time in Year 4 to talk about how Baptism differs to that of other Anglican faiths and spent time in Year 1 talking about prayer.

Reverend Alex has provided lots of support this week to a wide range of activities. Year 4 benefitted from his knowledge and guidance on their topic of parables. Year 5 were able to explore Jesus' miracles with a focus on what they tell us about Jesus and why they are important to Christians today. This afternoon, Reverend Alex hosted Class 2 at All Saints' Church where he demonstrated a baptism service which all of the children found really interesting and engaging. Reverend Tim has also worked in school this week with Class 3 with one of our Big Questions to help them prepare for their forthcoming class-led collective worship.

Thank you to Mrs Frost and Mrs Van Weede who supported our theme week with the following tasty treats: biryani, Mandel bread, samosas and hot cross buns.
