
MADD Week 2020

MUSIC

- **Draw what you hear** Put on a favourite or a new piece of music and paint or draw what you hear use shape, pattern and colour as you like to show what the music sounds like to you.

- <u>Conduct an orchestra</u> You might have seen this amazing orchestra perform on Britain's Got Talent recently <u>https://youtu.be/DupiDw hrr4</u> The players did an amazing job of memorizing their music and playing together without a conductor! Why don't you try conducting to this clip or another great piece of orchestra music - this can be really good exercise!
- <u>Play whatever you can</u> Find something that makes a noise and playalong with these excellent tracks for making music at home. <u>https://youtu.be/lyhsTdfEL1E</u> If you prefer, choose your own music and make your own plan for who plays what and when.

MUSIC

- <u>Can you make a sound that's like a colour</u>? Use your voice or find sounds or use instruments to represent a colour. What does green sound like? Does blue sound higher or lower? Does orange sound quieter or louder, or faster or slower? What happens when you put colours together?

Colour

- Make a rainbow coloured sculpture using objects you can find


- Look out for our Once Upon a Wednesday writing challenge – maybe you could write something to perform.
