P.E./Games

Homework

Children in Class 3 are expected to do approximately 15 minutes reading with an adult per night. Reading is an important part of homework and children in this class benefit greatly from reading with an adult and talking about the book they are reading to practise their comprehension skills. In addition to this, children are expected to practise times tables daily and they will record in their School Diary the table they are focussing on. In Class 3 children will be set a weekly maths task each Monday, which will sometimes be online; this should take approximately 20 minutes to complete and the children will hand this in on the following Monday. Children should bring their reading book and School Planner to school each day.
